The Pastor's Corner



Whether we were working with cows that had a calf, or a hen with her chicks, the story was always the same: if the mom thought you were a threat to their calf or their chicks, you'd have to go through them first. If we needed to check on the young, often times the mother of whatever it was would immediately go into a stance of defense- and it didn't matter who we were, the mother would clearly give herself up first, before letting anyone touch her young! It's really a story of selfless sacrifice, and one that we can easily witness throughout much of the animal kingdom.

As Jesus is instructing the disciples, He begins to speak of His coming Passion. To help the disciples understand this better He gives an analogy of wheat: "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat." There has to be a death to self to give life, and perhaps even more fruitful life. The idea is contradictory to the worldly way of living which often focuses on self-preservation. However, if the grain of wheat focused on that, it would never produce anything of value, and would eventually fall back into dust. Jesus wants something different-death to self, and living for others, and producing much fruit as a result.

It is all too easy to focus on self-preservation and promoting ourselves, and not looking out for one another. Even just a casual drive can tell us how self-focused we have become as a society- cutting off motorists, speeding past others and perhaps even driving with little regard for the safety or others around us. Yet, what would happen if we were that grain of wheat? What if we chose to die to self to promote life around us?

What would happen if we were like that cow with a calf or that hen with chicks? What if -Fr. Belken we were all about sacrifice for one another?


