KEEP YOUR EYE ON THE BALL

With these warmer days emerging, I find my mind drifting off to the ball fields I played on when I was younger. One piece of advice that was always thrown at me when we were playing was "Keep your eye on the ball!" The reason for this was quite simple: as a child, you are very distractable- and when you were up to bat, pitching, catching, or playing, it can be so easy to pay attention to all sorts of things that would distract you from the ball that was being thrown at you or that was hit your way. You had to be watching what matteredand not what didn't.

This Sunday we hear the Gospel about the Transfiguration, and naturally we can be led to wonder what that would have been like to be there, and to behold Jesus speaking with Moses and Elijah. It was such a sight that we can see evidence that they were startled, but also that they wanted that moment never to end. Yet, it did end, and shortly thereafter, they suffered through watching the Passion and Death of the Lord. They only revisited the Transfiguration when Jesus finally rose from the dead- and they live in that now eternally in heaven.

Life is often very difficult, and a lot of things go wrong. There are all sorts of twists and turns, hiccups, injustices, wounds, and sorrows that we have to contend with. These are so great in our mind, that often they become a sort of force that takes all of our attention- even sometimes being what we get fixated on or preoccupied with. Yet, the Transfiguration reminds us of something: even with the trials and the difficulties we deal with - the Light of Christ still wants to help us through these moments- if we keep our eyes fixed on the Lord. The hope and promise of greater things never should fade from our hearts and our minds. The light and hope that Christ gives us is always there, even in our most difficult moments of life; may we, when we encounter our Lord, always keep "our eye on the ball."


