## My Sheep Hear My Voice

As we go through our days, we likely hear a variety of voices speaking to us. Some of these are very pleasant and speak things that are easy to hear: compliments, affirmations, encouragement, amongst other things. Some voices are informative, and there is little inflection on them. Some voices, however, are very hard to hear. These are the voices that speak things that are a little less charming to the ear: a rebuke, a correction, or even at times some criticism. There are many voices that speak to us, and really, we don't have much choice in which ones are speaking- but we do have a choice in the ones we listen to and remember.

The Gospel today is very plain. Jesus starts off this Gospel reading with this line: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me." The line seems beautiful, and it is, but it is also laced with a challenge. There is a call: My sheep hear my voice. Then, more critically, there is a necessary response: they follow me. The reason that both elements must be together is that we need to understand that the voice of Christ is going to say both things pleasing to the ear, and things that are challenging. He will speak things that are pleasant: the affirmation we never receive, the feeling of being treasured and valued, the encouragement to push through hard times, and being called a child of God. However, that voice will also tell us some things that are challenging as well: to stop making excuses, to follow the Gospel better, to quit being lazy with our faith, or maybe even to be more selfless and love those around us more. His voice is speaking but are we going to respond and follow?

We cannot chose what the voice of Christ is saying. He speaks to us very boldly. The question is, whenever Christ speaks, no matter the tone, are we going to trust Him enough to not only hear His voice, but to follow Him as well?
