"GETTING THEM STARTED"

While there are many different cans of products we used on the farm, one that had a special purpose was the can of starting fluid. This can of fluid had one simple purpose it was there to kick-start an engine usually a diesel or the old gasoline tractor and to get it going up to full speed, even if it was stubbornly refusing to start. Often, especially on cold winter days, that was the only way we were going to get it moving and up to the task that was ahead.

Pentecost Sunday is a beautiful celebration that continues the work of Christ via the apostles and disciples that were gathered that day. They were in a locked room, which was bolted shut out of their own fear. They would have stayed in this room, had it not been for that sudden shot of the Holy Spirit- their "starting fluid" which finally got them up to the task that laid ahead. They weren't just started, but they were equipped with far more power than before and were able to speak in ways that reached the ears of everyone that was before them and that they were sent to preach to.

We, too, have an audience to preach to, and we do not do it alone or at least we shouldn't. We live in a world filled with people that are indeed stuck and not moving and we are the ones that have been appointed to go and speak to every person from the gift we have received. We too should be asking for this constant gift of the Spirit, so that we may not grow cold, or refuse to start for the task that is ahead. There are so many that need to hear the word of God and we are the ones that need to do that. May we be bold and ask the Lord for the gift of the Spirit that we need to preach, as the disciples received that day. May a simple prayer be on our lips today: "Come, Holy Spirit."
